

PENIS: An external reproductive and sex organ on most males' bodies.

TESTICLES: Also called the *testes*; two egg-shaped glands inside the scrotum that produce sperm.

UTERUS: Also called the *womb*; the reproductive organ inside which a fetus develops during pregnancy.

URETHRA: The internal tube that leads from the bladder to the outside of the body to release urine. All bodies have a urethra.

VAGINA: The passage that connects the vulva to the uterus. Most babies are born by passing from the uterus into the vagina and then out of the body.

VULVA: A sex organ on the outside of most females' bodies. It includes the clitoris, the labia (inner and outer lips), the opening of the urethra, and the opening of the vagina.
